Acknowledgement of Paternity (AOP)

An Acknowledgement of Paternity (AOP) is a legal document that allows parents who aren't married to establish legal paternity.

Who can complete an Acknowledgement of Paternity (AOP)?

Biological parents who want to establish their child's legal rights to his or her father can voluntarily establish paternity with an Acknowledgement of Paternity (AOP).

How to File an Acknowledgement of Paternity (AOP)

To complete and file an AOP, both parents must work with an AOP-certified entity. AOP-certified entities have been trained by the Office of the Attorney General to help parents voluntarily establish paternity.
