

Deferred Adjudication

What is Deferred Adjudication?

In some cases, you may request deferred adjudication from the Court. If you have a good driving record, and you are not currently on deferred disposition, you may make a request to the Court. Deferred disposition means you will be placed on probation for a period ranging from 4 to 6 months and pay court costs and an administrative fee. Contact the court for more information at 281-341-3742.

If you successfully comply with the terms of your probation without receiving a moving violation anywhere in the State of Texas, the original charge will be dismissed. Conditions of deferred disposition may include: Driving Safety Course, Alcohol or Tobacco Awareness, Community Service or any other program required by law or the Court.

Deferred Adjudication is at the Judges discretion. You may appear on your court date to request Deferred Adjudication from the Judge.
